

## Malaria Consortium Non-Traditional Funding Policy

## 1. Context

The need for an organisational ethical policy became clear during discussions at Malaria Consortium Board meetings regarding what decision-making protocols were needed when it came to doing business with certain types of donors. The policy has since evolved from a draft ethical policy for internal guidance (operating procedures) to a succinct statement of policy for 'non-traditional funding' to be published on Malaria Consortium's website.

## 2. Policy

Non-traditional funding is monies coming from Foundations, Trusts and Corporates as opposed to Governments or established Multi-lateral organisations (such as the Global Fund for Aids, TB and Malaria/UNICEF).

Malaria Consortium's policy is:

- Not to receive funds from companies whose activities or products are directly incompatible with Malaria Consortium's mission and objectives as a health organisation, including specifically the Tobacco and Alcohol Sectors.
- To conduct formally and carefully due diligence of all other non-traditional funding opportunities/sources on a case-by-case basis, taking into account potential international and local sensitivities. Recommendations to accept any non-traditional funding shall be subject to the approval of the Chief Executive.

The policy and its regulation will be reviewed annually.

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
